SUMMARY:

God has no pleasure in a hypocrite (Isaiah 9:17). Yet perhaps Christians sometimes displease God with this fruit of the devil, because it is so hard to detect and purge out of our own lives. It is so easy to see it in others but only by the closest scrutiny to our own lives, can we determine just what motivates our every action. What others see in us isn't always what God sees. We can become whited sepulchers full of dead men's bones (Matthew 23:27).

TIME: Approximately 35 A.D. during the early years of the church.

QUARTERLY THEME: The Early Church

TOPIC: A DIVINE DELIVERANCE

INTRODUCTION:

“But the angel of the Lord by night opened the prison doors, and brought them forth; and said, Go, stand and speak in the temple to the people all the words of this life.” (Acts 5:19-20)

What a time of rejoicing this deliverance must have been for these apostles. But they did not seek safety in their homes to rejoice. Instead they faithfully obeyed the voice of the Lord and returned to the very place where they had been captured and then imprisoned. Surely they knew the high priest would again molest them, but they knew God’s command and their whole-hearted desire was to obey. Their love for Him and faith in Him made them obey whether they would again be delivered or not.

They were beaten but not imprisoned, and they went their way rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer for Him. Can we do the same? Are we willing to endanger ourselves to witness for Him? Can we rejoice when we are persecuted for Him?

CENTRAL TRUTH: God works on behalf of those who give Him first place in their lives.

GOLDEN TEXT: *WE OUGHT TO OBEY GOD RATHER THAN MEN.*
Acts 5:29

Peter and the other apostles had feared the God of their fathers since childhood. They had walked with Jesus for three years during His ministry and He had taught them of His Father and of the Gospel of Grace. Yet, during Jesus’ trial and crucifixion they had forsaken or denied Him. What a change the Holy Spirit made in their lives! They now boldly could say, “we ought to obey God rather than men.” They knew that God gave the Holy Ghost to those that obey Him. (Acts 5:32) They knew also that it was by the power of the Holy Spirit that they could continue to obey in spite of all opposition.

We can know about the Grace of God through Christ, His Son, but unless we allow the Spirit to be our guide and strength, we will fail in our efforts to obey God rather than men.
