QUARTERLY THEME: Christ the Son of Man

TOPIC: BIRTH OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

INTRODUCTION:

The birth of John the Baptist illustrated the faithfulness of God in keeping His promises. Not only was the promise given to his parents fulfilled, but also the prophecy of the coming of the "voice of him that crieth in the wilderness." (Isaiah 40:3) Also, through Zacharias, God renewed His promise of a redeemer in the house of David. God was long in fulfilling His promise which was first made to Adam and Eve, later to Abraham, and at various times through His prophets, being no less faithful. God waits until the right time.

His faithfulness to us today is just as sure. "Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ." (Philippians 1:6) Certainly, faith cometh by hearing, and to hear or read of God's faithfulness to various Bible characters and in sending a Savior should strengthen our faith in Him.

CENTRAL TRUTH: God wants to use us to prepare the way for the Savior.

GOLDEN TEXT: FOR THOU SHALT GO BEFORE THE FACE OF THE LORD TO PREPARE HIS WAYS.

Luke 1:76

The coming of a Messiah was not new to God's people - it had been prophesied many centuries before Christ's coming. On the other hand, His coming was new. The people needed to know that Christ's coming was not in the distant future, but that the Kingdom of Heaven was at hand. The people needed to be prepared by humbling themselves and turning from sin. John the Baptist was sent to prepare the Way for Christ by giving knowledge of salvation.

For many people today the message of Christ is not new, and yet it is new. Many have heard His name preached, but they don't understand that He is from above and not of this world. They don't really understand that Christ gives salvation by the remission of sin. The task of preparing hearts for Christ is necessary today. Children must learn about the Lord in preparation for the time when Christ will call them to commit their lives unto Him. Adults who don't know Christ must be made aware of the necessity to seek the Lord for salvation.
