SUMMARY:

The Bible teaches us that this should not be, but rather we should be kind and considerate and be concerned about how the things we do will affect others.

In order to have the blessing of righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit (vs. 17), all bickering over non-essential things must be stopped and instead pursue those things which edify one another.

QUARTERLY THEME: Marks of a Christian

TOPIC: LOVE

INTRODUCTION:

Love is the foundation upon which true Christianity is built. Christ died for us because He loved us. For this our hearts are filled with love for Him. But the action or result of this love is seen by our love toward mankind. We cannot love God without loving others.

We may possess a natural love toward those that love us, but to love those that hate or persecute us needs a divine love. We read of this divine love in 1 Corinthians 13. We are told that such love suffers long, is kind, is not jealous, proud or boastful, does not seek for self, is not provoked, thinks no evil, bears all things, etc.

How is a person able to love in this divine fashion? Only God can supply this love within our hearts. We love others and Him, if we permit Him to supply the love.

CENTRAL TRUTH: Appreciation for what God's love has done for us will cause us to love God and others.

GOLDEN TEXT: HEREIN IS LOVE, NOT THAT WE LOVED GOD, BUT THAT HE LOVED US, AND SENT HIS SON TO BE THE PROPITIATION FOR OUR SINS.

1 John 4:10

In our meditations on the marks of a Christian, we began with faith and now come to the greatest fruit of the Spirit, which is love. As our Christian walk begins with faith, we realize the love that God has for us—to give His only Son that we need not perish! When we can believe that the gift of salvation is for us, our hearts are filled with love for one another and for God who loved us first. But, how often we lose much of that “first love”. How hard it is then to attain the other marks of a Christian, for all that we strive to do or become in Christ must be made “perfect in love”. Good works alone are not enough, if Christ must say to us, “nevertheless I have somewhat against thee, because thou has left thy first love”. (Revelation 2:4)

May our love for others be so exercised that our love for God might be strengthened.
