

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

1. Did Peter err in going fishing?
2. Why did Jesus ask the disciples if they had any meat?
3. Why didn't the disciples recognize the Lord?
4. Why didn't the Lord bid Peter to walk on the water on this occasion?

SUMMARY:

In this incident Jesus gave three commands. The first was a test of obedience after a night of fruitless toil. The second was to bring in the catch. The third was an invitation to join Him in food and fellowship. He still gives many simple instructions to us for our spiritual and physical benefit.

Is Christ the El Shaddai of your life, the all-sufficient One for all your needs, whether temporal or spiritual? He wonderfully demonstrated His tender love and care in this scene on the beach at daybreak. He still demonstrates His all-sufficiency in this twentieth century of complex cares and responsibilities. Yes, He still lovingly cares for us.

QUARTERLY THEME: Christ, the Son of God

TOPIC: CHRIST RESTORES PETER

INTRODUCTION:

Not too many days had passed since Peter had experienced a real crisis in his life. By nature, being a very aggressive individual, he also had the problem of being unusually self-confident.

As Peter was listening to Jesus explain about the events of His suffering in the days ahead, he was aroused to action. No one was going to harm his Master. To prove his point, he drew his sword and cut off the ear of the High Priest's servant. Could any man have a greater devotion to his Master than Peter, who was willing to risk his life for Him? (John 13:37-38; 18:10)

Little did bold and self-confident Peter realize that his seemingly insignificant denial of Jesus would be announced by a triumphant crowing of a rooster at the dawning of a new day. (John 18:15-27)

CENTRAL TRUTH: The quality of our love for Christ determines the closeness of our relationship to him.

GOLDEN TEXT: *LOVEST THOU ME MORE THAN THESE?*

John 21:15

For Peter it was indeed a dawning of a new day. He suddenly realized his total inadequacy, secluded himself and wept bitter tears of remorse. (Luke 22:62)

Before Jesus' ascension, the Lord reminded him that true love and faithfulness is demonstrated by more than just idle words. Good intentions are not enough. There must be grace from above to carry them out.
