QUARTERLY THEME: BOOK OF "HEBREWS"

TOPIC: THE BELIEVER'S DEVELOPMENT

INTRODUCTION:

In studying chapter 11 we see a list of many witnesses who have gone before us. The Apostle calls our attention to all of these witnesses and makes a marked reference to our need of separating from ourselves anything that would hinder us in running the race that is set before us. In other words we should let nothing be present in our lives that would weaken us or make us unfit to attain the prize.

We are reminded too that God chastises those whom He loves. Just as a father chastises a disobedient child so that child can learn the lessons of life, so likewise God chastens us. We must not become discouraged in this but rather let it work its purpose in us.

We must live our lives circumspectly before God. We must put aside the things of this life and put on the things of God. We must live holy, peaceable lives if we are to see the Lord. Those who lack in this shall not see Him. One thing to which the Apostle makes reference is bitterness which apparently afflicts many people and has terrible effects. May we find grace to recognize this evil if it is present in us and with God's help cast it from us.

Lastly, we must serve God. We cannot serve two masters. God is a jealous God and will not tolerate anything less than total yieldedness to Him. How do we stand in the sight of God?

CENTRAL TRUTH: By allowing God to work in our lives we come to spiritual maturity.

GOLDEN TEXT: *LET US LAY ASIDE EVERY WEIGHT, AND THE SIN WHICH DOTHSO EASILY BESET US, AND LET US RUN WITH PATIENCE THE RACE THAT IS SET BEFORE US.*

Hebrews 12:1

It is often easier said than done! Yet in reference to spiritual things it is so important for us to fight a good fight, or to run the race.

In the field of athletics, a coach sets down stringent rules to be followed by all members of the team. A player must not "drink" because that weakens his senses and his ability to think. He must not "smoke" because that causes shortness of breath. He must not "overeat" because that makes him sluggish. In other words he must lay aside every weight that besets him.

Spiritually, our separation is even more distinct and exacting because what we do, often is displeasing to God. It robs us of time and talents that should be used for Him. Whatever we do, we should ask ourselves the question "Will this glorify God? Are we using our physical stamina and our mental capacities to serve Him?"

Let us ask ourselves if we are laying aside every weight as well as the sins that take our time and talent from the service of the Lord. Let us ask ourselves: "Is the race we are running - the race of materialism and self-satisfaction or is it the spiritual race which requires the giving of our all to Him?"
