

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

1. Why is there less evangelization and growth of the church today than in the early church?
2. The word “assay” (vs. 7) means to try or test. How do we “test” things in our lives to determine the Spirit’s leading?
3. To what extent should a believer stand up for his “rights”? (vs. 37)
4. How might the Spirit have “forbidden” them to preach the word in Asia? (vs. 6) Why would he forbid them?
5. What works were wrought by the jailer?

SUMMARY:

The example of the lives of the apostles in early times is a pattern for our Christian behavior today. The power of God and the message of His Son are as powerful as ever, and the need for courageous workers is the same today as then. **[SoF:15]** Each believer must follow the leading of God’s Spirit to carry out the task that is required no matter what the size.

NOTES:

[SoF:15] We believe that the Great Commission of our Lord Jesus Christ is an invitation for everyone to live a life of abandonment to Him, Who loved us and gave Himself for us - surrendering His personal ambitions and possessions in an unreserved committal to take the proclamation of the Gospel throughout "all the world to every creature".

TOPIC: CHRISTIAN ATTITUDES

INTRODUCTION:

Joy, peace and contentment may well be termed the gyroscope of the Christian Life. Perhaps no other contributing factors are as powerful in stabilizing our storm-tossed ship of faith than these three precious jewels. Don't mistake joy for fun, peace for lack of strife, contentment for dumb resignation. These are virtues that penetrate far deeper than the surface of our lives.

Nehemiah said, "...for the *JOY OF THE LORD* is your strength."
—Nehemiah 8:10

David said, "*Great peace have they which love Thy law and NOTHING SHALL OFFEND THEM*". —Psalm 119:165

Job said, "*Though He slay me, YET WILL I TRUST IN HIM. . . .*"
—Job 13:15

What do you say?

"Thank you, Lord, for these precious jewels. Let them become real in my life."

CENTRAL TRUTH: Whatever the circumstances in which we find ourselves, we can count on God's faithfulness.

GOLDEN TEXT: *NOT THAT I SPEAK IN RESPECT OF WANT: FOR I HAVE LEARNED, IN WHATSOEVER STATE I AM, THEREWITH TO BE CONTENT.*
Philippians 4:11

None of us have any problem with discontentment as long as things go well in our lives. But let poverty, sickness, loneliness, rejection or persecution befall us, then our contentment shows itself to be a mere facade, uncovering our great spiritual lack. Worry and fretting take over in our lives. We ask "Why must it be me?"

These virtues were not handed to Paul on a platter. He, like all of us, had to learn these things the hard way. In the final analysis, he realized that it was only through Jesus—"In Him".

In the midst of testing, remember what God is trying to do with you, look up to Him, and thank Him for His love and wisdom. He is preparing you for Heaven. This is the only way the precious virtues can be added to your life, and He's doing it as gently as He can. When the trial is over, you shall come forth as gold.
