QUARTERLY THEME: God's People in Captivity

TOPIC: JEREMIAH FORETELLS CAPTIVITY

INTRODUCTION:

The Israelite people, chosen to be the children of God, had become so self-willed and rebellious against God that He was about to bring judgment upon them. Yet even in these last hours He was desirous to show mercy and compassion upon them. He gave a last plea for the people to turn from their evil ways and to serve Him. He warned that they would suffer a period of captivity if they did not repent. It is history now—that they did not repent—and the promised judgment came upon the people.

Even as it became a reality, the love of God again was demonstrated when He encouraged them to be faithful in the land of their captivity so they could continue to be a nation of people that He might deliver them and return them to the land He had promised.

So likewise today, God still pleads with man to turn from his sins and serve Him. He has provided a way of deliverance from the captivity of sin so that all that would seek this deliverance may have access to the promise of God. We must make the choice! Do we desire deliverance and a share in the kingdom of God, or do we rather choose captivity with its final end, judgment and destruction?

CENTRAL TRUTH: Blessed is the man who comes to the end of life, knowing he has done the will of God.

GOLDEN TEXT: *HE, THAT BEING OFTEN REPROVED HARDENETH HIS NECK, SHALL SUDDENLY BE DESTROYED, AND THAT WITHOUT REMEDY.*
Proverbs 29:1

The story of the Israelites before the time of the captivity is a testimony of our Golden Text. Prophets had been sent to warn them to put off idolatry and worldly associations but they persisted in their willful ways. Not only did they persist, but even mistreated the prophets. At one time they besought Jeremiah to ask God what they should do. When he brought God's answer back to them, they said "God didn't tell this to you."

Today when people are reproved they will often answer "If you want to apply that to your life, that's fine, but don't try to force it upon us."

May we never forget that God calls us to a life of holiness and righteousness and separation from the world. Anything short of this arouses God's displeasure. Those who persist in ways contrary to this, little by little, become hardened against God's ways. There soon follows justification for many things not pleasing to God.

May we never forget that God is the final Judge. Anyone deliberately falling short of that which He asks shall come under His judgment.
