SUMMARY:

Wise men came from a far distant eastern country to look for Jesus, being students of the Jewish scriptures and having believed the prophecies of His coming, even studying out the time of His coming. They followed the Star with only one error—going to Jerusalem (the capital city) instead of following direct to Bethlehem.

Having found Him in Bethlehem, they worshipped Him and then returned home. God's protection then is revealed as Joseph and Mary, with Jesus, flee from the dangers of his mortal enemies. God also will watch over us as His children.

LESSON SETTING: Jerusalem

QUARTERLY THEME: Christ - King and Savior

TOPIC: SINNING AGAINST THE HOLY SPIRIT

INTRODUCTION:

Jesus had just performed another miracle. So often these things were done on the Sabbath and the charge was always made the He was a "Sabbath breaker." This apparently was not the Sabbath, so another charge was made, this time that He was performing these by the power of Satan. He taught them the lesson that a house divided against itself cannot stand. He also taught that the devils were cast out by the power of God and because of these manifestations they had evidence of the coming of God's kingdom into their midst.

He told them also that there is no middle ground. They can only be walking in two paths, either for Him or against Him. We today are in the same position. Whose side are we on?

The gravest warning given in scripture also was given on this occasion. The sin against the Holy Spirit is unpardonable. This can be done in several ways, vexing the spirit (Isaiah 63:10), reference to Jesus as being unclean (Mark 3:30), lying to the Spirit (Acts 5:3), grieving the Spirit (Ephesians 4:30), and having partaken of the Holy Spirit and falling away (Hebrews 6:4-6; 10:26-31).

CENTRAL TRUTH: The indwelling Spirit is the power by which believers are enabled to witness. He must be honored and revered.

GOLDEN TEXT: *FEAR GOD, AND KEEP HIS COMMANDMENTS FOR THIS IS THE WHOLE DUTY OF MAN.* Ecclesiastes 12:13

These are the concluding words of Solomon as he reviewed his life and saw the calling that he had of God as ruler of the Israelite people, but how he also had failed. He had turned from a way of humility and obedience to God to one of self-will, doing many things that had been forbidden. He now recognized the achievements of man as being vanity. He recognized that man's whole duty is to obey God and serve Him. He had learned that to bring his own will into being not only brings God's displeasure but also His judgments. The final recorded words of Solomon were these, "*God will bring every deed into judgment, with every secret thing, whether good or evil.*" Let us ever seek to keep God's commands, remembering that if we disobey Him we can expect His judgment. "*It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God.*" (Hebrews 10:31)
