LESSON SETTING: Jesus in a boat preaching to the multitudes gathered on the shore of the Sea of Galilee.

TIME: About 28 -31 A.D.

QUARTERLY THEME: Christ - King and Savior

TOPIC: CHRIST, THE MASTER JUDGE

INTRODUCTION:

In the Kingdom of Heaven the tares were permitted to live and grow side by side with the wheat until the end of the world. Then they were separated: the tares to be burned; the wheat to be harvested and saved. In the world the unconverted live and grow side by side with the converted until the end. Then they are separated. The Master makes no mistake. The unconverted or nominal Christian may look so much like the converted Christian that man cannot tell the difference, even as the tares look very much like the true wheat, but the Lord knows the difference and is a righteous judge. He makes no mistakes, but He does permit all to live side by side until their days are fulfilled. Then the judgment is pronounced and each is given his just reward. A fearful judgment awaits those who do not accept the gospel of Jesus Christ.

CENTRAL TRUTH: The effectiveness of the Word of God depends upon the attitude with which men receive it.

GOLDEN TEXT: SO THEN EVERY ONE OF US SHALL GIVE ACCOUNT OF HIMSELF TO GOD.

Romans 14:12

We could never stand in the judgment before God and clear ourselves with our own account, were it not for our Master, Savior and High Priest, the very Son of God, who redeemed us with His own blood. A loving Elder Brother tells how he was imprisoned during the war in Europe. He pleaded with God, not for freedom, but that his children might seek the Lord's salvation, even offering his own life in return for this favor from God. His children did seek and find salvation, but God revealed to His faithful servant that his life would not be required in return, since God's own Son had already paid the price to redeem the whole world.

Of what then shall we give account to God? *“And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil.”* (John 3:19) *“How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation?”* (Hebrews 2:3)
