QUARTERLY THEME: Marks of a Christian

TOPIC: VICTORY

INTRODUCTION:

Victory is the overcoming of the devil, the world, and the flesh. Overcoming results in eternal life and we read in Revelation “that he who overcomes shall not be hurt of the second death (2:11), shall be given the hidden manna and a white stone (2:17), power over the nations (2:26), clothed in white raiment (3:5), be a pillar in the temple of my God (3:12), and granted to sit with Christ on His throne” (3:21).

Not only are all the blessings of victory for the next life, but also for this life. We are promised victory over Satan, the world, and our own flesh. His grace is promised to be sufficient (2 Corinthians 12:9), we are to be strengthened with might by His Spirit (Ephesians 3:16) and God shall supply all our needs (Philippians 4:19).

In all temptations He promises to help us. These promises we can claim only if we live a completely yielded life, leaving all in His hands and being fully dependent upon Him and a life of faith . . . “This is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith.” (1 John 5:4b) “But thanks be to God which giveth us the victory.” (1 Corinthians 15:57)

CENTRAL TRUTH: God promises great blessings to those who live overcoming lives.

GOLDEN TEXT: BLESSED IS THE MAN THAT ENDURETH TEMPTATION FOR WHEN HE IS TRIED, HE SHALL RECEIVE THE CROWN OF LIFE, WHICH THE LORD HATH PROMISED TO THEM THAT LOVE HIM.
James 1:12

When there is no battle there can be no victory. God allowed man to choose through disobedience, to know good and evil. As James has written, God does not tempt man to evil, but allows Satan through our fleshly desires to tempt us, thereby showing us that we need God's help to overcome evil. God permitted Satan to try Job, only to provide something more for Job after his victory.

The Spirit led Jesus into the wilderness where He met Satan face to face, to overcome his temptations by the power of God's Word.

Paul endured all manner of trial and testing, yet could write, “and the Lord shall deliver me from every evil work, and will preserve me unto His heavenly kingdom: To whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.” (2 Timothy 4:18)
