QUARTERLY THEME: Marks of a Christian

TOPIC: STEWARDSHIP

INTRODUCTION:

A steward is one who cares for the possessions of another, who has charge of or manages another's things. As Christians on this earth, we are God's stewards, to make the most of that which belongs to Him. All things are His. He loans to us what we think of as ours. They are in reality His, not ours. Without Him, we have nothing. Our health, wealth, time, possessions, talents, our very bodies are His. In order to be good and faithful stewards, we must do what He wants us to do with these possessions.

How can we know what His will is for us? Do we have the right to spend His money the way we wish? Do we have the right to endanger our health in earthly pleasures, to use our time or talents for our own enjoyment? How can we know what He wishes us to do? By looking up to Him and believing that He will show us. He will make all clear and give us the strength to obey if we but believe. In Philippians 2:13, Paul says, "For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of His good pleasure." Can we rest upon this?

CENTRAL TRUTH: Believers are stewards under God of all they own, all they are, and all they can become.

GOLDEN TEXT: IT IS REQUIRED IN STEWARDS, THAT A MAN BE FOUND FAITHFUL. 1 Corinthians 4:2

Some might feel, that having little of this world's goods, they could not be considered as stewards. Actually, we are all stewards in God's sight, in several different areas. When we received these earthly bodies as a temporary tabernacle, we were not to spend them in selfish dissipation, but in service to others and to God.

God also entrusted us with our souls, for as He said, "Behold, all souls are mine." (Ezekiel 18:4) Since a way of salvation is prepared, as good stewards we must preserve our souls to eternal life.

Any material possession with which we might be entrusted is also a gift of God, to be used according to His will.

Finally, when we receive and believe the Gospel, we should become stewards of the Grace of God, ready to share the spiritual blessings with others. As faithful stewards we should share God's gifts, that His Name might be glorified.
